**SUBJECT:** Public Hearing Announcement for the State of Mississippi's Five-Year Consolidated Plan

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**1. Purpose:** The State of Mississippi is currently developing a Five-year Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development. This study is required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and will guide housing, community development, and infrastructure investment policy and actions such as housing, economic development, public facility, water, and infrastructure investment over the next several years. The consolidated planning process serves as the framework for a community-wide dialogue to identify housing and community development priorities.

The Mississippi Home Corporation (MHC) manages the state's housing funds awarded by HUD and is the agency responsible for submitting the state's Five-Year Consolidated Plan to HUD. The state annually receives over \$13 million to operate four housing programs: Home Investment Partnership (HOME), Housing for Persons with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and the National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF) programs. Additionally, the Mississippi Development Authority (MDA) receives over \$25 million in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds annually.

To further assist the State of Mississippi, citizens input for the five-year plan is essential to ensure a thorough representation of the views held by people throughout the state and we urge citizens to complete an online survey located at <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/TF5NQ6T>.

**2. Discussion:** MHC and MDA will conduct a public hearing for the development of the Five-Year Consolidated Plan and encourages all citizens, local officials, non-profit organizations, stakeholders and community groups to attend. The public hearing is scheduled at the following location.
